

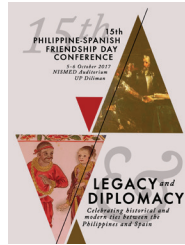

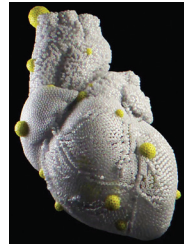

The Melbourne Forum brings together practitioners and scholars on constitution building from across Asia and the Pacific to share their experiences of constitution building. Speakers at the Forum have been directly involved in the processes of constitution building in their respective states and polities, and the Forum thus provides an opportunity for meaningful comparison and in depth discussion of the challenges of constitution building. While the focus of the Forum is on experiences in Asia and the Pacific, the issues to be explored have global relevance and the inclusion of two case studies from Latin America will provide an opportunity for wider comparative learning.

The forum is co-organized by the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance and the Constitution Transformation Network at the Melbourne Law School, University of Melbourne. The forum is hosted by the Department of Political Science, UP Diliman.

Legacy & Diplomacy: Celebrating Historical and Modern Ties Between the Philippines and Spain

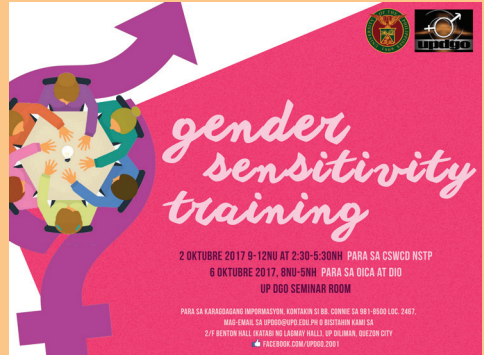

2017 marks the 70th year of modern diplomatic relations between the Philippines and Spain. These diplomatic ties mirrored the Philippines' mutual commitment to pursue beneficial initiatives as it recognized our unique connection in history. It is also a fortunate circumstance that 70 years ago, one of the earliest texts and illustrations on the Philippines in the 16th century came into the possession of Prof. Charles R. Boxer, which now bears the name Boxer Codex. The manuscript describes the customs in Luzon and the Visayas, but it is best known for the illustrations that are the earliest representations of the Tagalogs, Visayans, Cagayanons and Negritos. The contents of the Boxer Codex present the initial contact between two worlds, signaling the beginning of the history of Philippine-Spanish relations. The conference will feature research works that focus on these landmark events.

The conference is organized by the UP Department of History and the National Historical Commission of the Philippines.

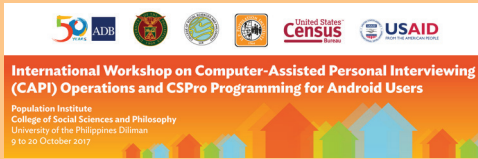


Gender Sensitivity Training

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International Workshop on Computer-Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI) Operations and CSPro Programming for Android Users

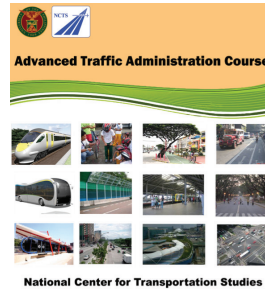

Workshop participants will gain insight into the planning and management of computer-assisted personal interviewing (CAPI) operations through the development of mock CAPI census or survey plans and schedules. Instructors will provide case studies where CAPI procedures were implemented to varying degrees of success and will discuss the resulting implications.

Moreover, using the open software Census and Survey Processing System (CSPro), participants will learn about ways to adapt survey instruments to smaller screens, to ensure data quality through integrated data checks and to control the user interface and program flow using logic programming. Participants will also learn to build tools for survey management, tracking and data transfer.

The event is organized by the UP Population Institute (UPPI) in collaboration with the United States Census Bureau, Asian Development Bank and United States Agency for International Development.

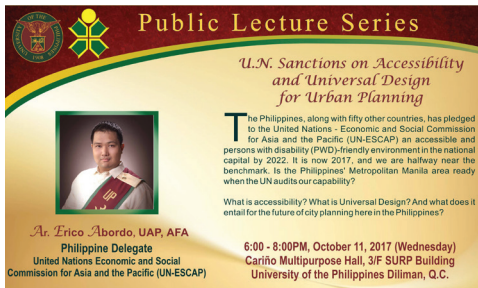
6th Advanced Traffic Administration Course

The training is a continuation of the Traffic Administration Course. This course gives an overview on land use and travel demand forecasting, introduction to trip generation and parking generation. Other topics to be discussed are basics of public transport system analysis and planning; project development cycle; traffic laws and regulations, government ordinances and other economic and environmental regulations; physical distribution and logistics; and environmentally sustainable transportation (EST) system fundamentals and strategies. A workshop applying EST concepts will also be conducted.
