


The Paralegal Training Program is an extension service and training program of the UP Law Center which aims to lay the foundation for the development and professionalization of paralegal work in the country.

World Bicycle Day “REQUITED” Screenings




The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) tapped the Phil-LiDAR Program to disseminate Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) products and to utilize and apply knowledge on open source geospatial processing tools, and come up with effective local government plans to more municipalities.

Selected LGUs were asked to send representatives from their local DILG, Planning, Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) and Engineering Offices. DOST and DILG Regional Offices were also invited.

Covering 17 regions of the country, the training aims to expand the reach and power of GIS and LiDAR products in developing more proactive and responsive DRRM plans for the LGUs.

Suffer the Little Children to Come: Legal Rights of Unaccompanied Alien Children Under United States Federal Court Jurisprudence

Synopsis:
This article analyzes United States (US) federal court jurisprudence to determine the legal rights of unaccompanied alien children in various stages of immigration enforcement proceedings. After briefly discussing statistics on unaccompanied alien children in the US, it explains the legal context of US laws governing unaccompanied minors. Through examining 10 cases decided by the 12 US Circuit Courts of Appeals, the article explores how the federal courts interpreted and expanded on the legal rights of unaccompanied alien children upon apprehension by immigration officials, during placement or detention decisions at the Office of Refugee Resettlement, prior to voluntary departure, during asylum proceedings, when requested alien release, and while relevant pending immigration proceedings.

You Don't Have to Live Like a Refugee: The Politics of Refugee Resettlement in the United States

Synopsis:
Although the resettlement of refugees is deeply politically contentious in host countries, the current global refugee crisis has only magnified these contentions. In the United States and in many European countries there has been a strong backlash against the resettlement of refugees particularly those from Muslim-majority countries. However, within countries such as the US, there are areas of the country that are more open-minded than others. The purpose of this paper is to explore the variation in support or opposition to refugee resettlement across the 48 US states from 2000-2010. Refugee resettlement in the US is done in conjunction with the federal government, religious and secular non-profits, and state governments.

Nolasco's lecture gives an analysis of US federal court jurisprudence to determine the legal rights of unaccompanied alien children in various stages of immigration enforcement proceedings. The lecture by Braaten explores how state capacity, state politics and the religious composition of federal states explain refugee resettlement patterns within the US.


