

The Philippines organizes an exhibition of contemporary art in Southeast Asia in Manila to mark the 50th year of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN). The exhibit gathers 10 artists to represent the member-states of the organization. Taken from the ASEAN Declaration in 1967, the phrase "ties of history" may allude to the blessings and burdens of being together and being different in a region that is thought to be shared.

The exhibition opens on Aug. 8 (Metropolitan Museum of Manila), Aug. 9 (Yuchengco Museum) and Aug. 10 (Vargas Museum) and will run until Oct. 6. 
10th International Conference on Teacher Education

National Heroes' Day feature



The story is weaved together through interviews with his descendants, top World War II Philippine historians, official documents, and excerpts from articles written by Abad Santos's son, Pepito, who was with his father through his last days.
