Kyou-Dong Ahn is a lecturer at the Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (HUFS) Department of English Linguistics in South Korea. Currently, he is collaborating with the Eurasia3angle research group, which integrates linguistic, archaeological and genetic evidence to study the origin and dispersal of the Transeurasian family, at the Max Planck Institute for the Science of Human History in Jena, Germany. His publications include From Space to Grammar (2008), Constructions of Viewpoint Aspect and Grammaticalization of Negative Conditionals in Korean (2017), From Honor to Disparagement: The Pragmaticalization of -tapsiko in Korean, and Division and Characterization of Korean Dialects, which will appear in the Oxford Guide to Transeurasian Languages (forthcoming).


University Student Council Elections/Halalan UPD2019

Teaching Vocabulary in the Second/Foreign Language Classroom Using Japanese and Chinese Examples


