Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges: ASEAN's Way Forward

1 - 5 p.m. UP Asian Center

A special lecture will be delivered by Ambassador Elizabeth P. Buensuceso, Permanent Representative of the Philippines to the ASEAN and Chair at the ASEAN Institute for Peace and Reconciliation and Its Role in Preventing Crises (AIPR) Governing Council. Buensuceso has been with the Department of Foreign Affairs for over 38 years and has served as the ambassador to the Lao PDR and Norway, with concurrent accreditation to Denmark and Iceland. She was also posted in China, Belgium, Singapore and Hong Kong. In the Home Office, she was Assistant Secretary for European Affairs and Director or Assistant Director in the office of ASEAN Affairs, Economic Diplomacy Unit, Undersecretary for Policy and Cultural Affairs.

After the lecture, students taking up Asian Studies 256 will put up poster presentations whose topics cover the four pillars of the ASEAN: Political-Security Issues in ASEAN/ Southeast Asia; Economic Issues in ASEAN/Southeast Asia; Sociocultural Issues in ASEAN/Southeast Asia; and Environmental Issues in ASEAN/Southeast Asia.
