



A roundtable discussion and book launching





The book focuses on the "statesponsored history writing projects" in Indonesia and the Philippines in the 1970s — the Sejarah Nasional Indonesia (SNI) of Suharto and the Tadhana of Marcos. It examines the relationship between "embodiments of power (state, dictators, government officials) and knowledge (intellectuals, historians, history)."

Using the context of Suharto's and Marcos's authoritarian regimes, the book "shows the mutual need between scholars and political actors." Rather than co-opt the other, scholarship and politics coexist in these projects at a time of "competing nationalisms" and the state's "political consolidation." The book argues for the recognition of the entwined relationship of power and knowledge to realize scholarship's "progressive visions."


