Ageing and Health in the Philippines: Findings from the 2018 LSAHP"

The 2018 LSAHP is the first representative nationallv lonaitudinal studv of older people in the country. As part of a comparative study of ageing and health in the Philippines and Vietnam, the research provides an updated and comprehensive profile of older Filipinos focusing on their health and well being, as well as their caregivers and adult children. The study covered a total of 5,985 older person respondents aged 60 years and over, and was conducted from October 2018 to February 2019. Follow-up interviews will be done after two years.

This study will be valuable to policymakers, health professionals, organizations that provide services for older people, and workers in the fields of gerontology and geriatrics.



LSAHP is a collaboration project of the Demographic Research and Development Foundation, Inc., UP Population Institute of the College of Social Sciences and Philosophy, and the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia based in Jakarta, Indonesia.
