GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Competition is open to any combination of students (undergraduate and graduate), personnel, and faculty members of the University of the Philippines.
- 2. There are two stages in the competition—semifinal and final rounds.
- 3. A minimum of 16 and a maximum of 24 singers must comprise all participating choirs list names and voice classifications must be submitted.
- 4. Participants must show proof of enrollment (for students, most recent Form 5) and/or employment (for faculty and staff, current UP ID).
- 5. Established UP choirs* are not eligible to join the competition
- 6. The decision of the board of judges is final.
- 7. <u>Former Gawad Pangulo Choral Competition winners are automatically qualified to compete in the final round.</u> But they will have to submit the documentary requirements stated above, rules 3 and 4, by June 15, 2022.

*UP Madrigal Singers, UP Singing Ambassadors, UP Concert Chorus, UP Manila Chorale, UPLB Choral Ensemble, and other touring groups.

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

For the 1st Round / Semifinal Round: (2 songs)

- 1. A video collage of singers (mp4 format) of two contrasting choral pieces, with or without accompaniment, one of which must be a representative song (folksong) of the region where the CU is located.

- 2. Copies of songs performed at this stage must be submitted to the competition committee.
- 3. Photo collage of choir members with the conductor and accompanist, if applicable.
- 4. Any clear photo of the CU's Oblation statue.

For the Final Round: (2 songs)

- 1. Video collage of singers (1920x1080p/Full HD resolution) singing the **contest piece**. Pdf copies of the song will be distributed to choirs advancing to this round.
- 2. Any *a cappella* or accompanied (by one instrument only) choral piece NOTE: for #2, the choir may choose to use one of the two previously submitted choral pieces recording (from the semifinal round). They may re-record their chosen piece.
- 3. Total singing time for the 2 songs must not exceed 8 minutes.
- 4. Pdf copy of chosen piece performed at this stage must be submitted to the competition committee.
- 5. There should be a minimum of 16 and a maximum of 24 singers in each choir
